

COMMISSION MEETING

January 4, 2021

The New Castle City Commission meeting was held on Monday, January 4, 2021 at 6pm. Due to the Covid19 pandemic the meeting was held in the Locker Building to allow for social distancing. Present was Mayor Kurtz and Commissioners Mitchell, Thompson, Hay and Sevier. Also present was City Clerk Lynn Adams, City Attorney Josh Clubb, Public Works Director Joey Bramblett and Public Works Employee Vincent Bates.

Mayor Kurtz called the meeting to order.

Commissioner Hay made the motion to accept the minutes from all December meetings as presented. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. The motion did carry unanimously.

Commissioner Mitchell made the motion to approve all disbursements, deposits and transfers for the month of December. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion. It carried unanimously.

Commissioners Thompson and Sevier reviewed all city held accounts using the bank's online banking option.

Deputy Jamiel was unable to attend this evening as he was on a call.

The Tingle agreement still has not been signed. This will be tabled until this summer when it is hoped the pandemic will be substantially subsiding and the parties can meet to get this resolved.

The ordinance correcting the Caste Creek boundary is proving to be more involved than anticipated. The city must locate the final ordinance from 1979. A certified copy of the published ordinance could be used. Attorney Clubb is continuing to work on this issue and it is hoped that the City can move forward with correcting this in February.

Commissioner Thompson made the motion to have second reading of Ordinance #20-08, FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION ORDINANCE FOR NEW CASTLE, KENTUCKY. The Mayor seconded the motion and it did carry unanimously.

Attorney Clubb gave 2nd reading of Ordinance #20-08.

8Commissioner Sevier made the motion to adopt Ordinance #20-07. Commissioner Thompson second the motion. It carried unanimously.

The Mayor gave an update on the city's last application and draw request for "CARES ACT" funds.

Joey is back and doing great! He gave his report and thanked Vincent for taking care of everything while he was out.

As there was no further business to be addressed tonight, Commissioner Sevier made the motion to adjourn. Commissioner Thompson seconded the motion which carried unanimously.
